SANDALWOOD PLANTATION

Sandalwood (*Santalum album* L.) is a valuable tree associated with Indian culture. This second most expensive wood in the world, was introduced into India from Timor, Indonesia. The heartwood of the tree is treasured for its aroma and is one of the finest natural materials for carving. Sandalwood oil is used in perfumes, cosmetics, aromatherapy and pharmaceuticals. More than 90% of the sandalwood is distributed within the state of Karnataka and Tamil Nadu covering around 9,000 km² of which quite 70% occurs in Karnataka. During 2001 and 2002, Karnataka and Tamil Nadu governments have relaxed the prevailing rules and regulations associated with sandalwood in an attempt to spice up production through encouraging private domestication of sandalwood. In the past four years, 2,800 ha of agricultural land came under sandalwood cultivation in Gujarat, Andhra Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra and Uttarakhand, apart from Karnataka and Tamil Nadu. In order to revive the country's lost glory in sandalwood trade IIPMB in association IWST and KSDL is organizing a Webinar on Sustainable Sandalwood Plantation Management (SAP)
